Dear St. Agnes Parishioners,

This Sunday we celebrate Epiphany! Celebrate with the Magi! *Feliz día de Reyes!*

The *Magi*, who we hear about in the gospel, followed the star to Bethlehem, to see the Christ Child and honor him with gifts (Matthew 2:1-12). But what does 'epiphany' mean? An epiphany is a divine revelation or a sudden insight, an 'Aha!' Moment. 'Christ' means: *the anointed one*. So, on this holiday we mark a **divine revelation** to the world, an *Aha! Moment* for these wise figures from far off places, who perceived, by looking at the stars, that **God's anointed one had been born!**

Has God given you an epiphany? Have you ever perceived Christ, the anointed one, being born in your life? Had you been waiting and watching, like the wise *Magi* were by contemplating the stars? When you saw the sign, were you willing, as they were, to go deeper by taking a long journey to find out more? To lean in? To show your face and let God change you? **Waiting & Watching. Seeing & Perceiving. Leaning in.** That's how we join the *Magi* in their life-changing epiphany before the Christ, who came to love us all the way to eternity.

As I mentioned last Sunday during my homily, each one of you is part of my **St. Agnes Holy Family**. We are constantly trying to reach out to all of our family-parishioners. But we need you respond to us. We are your family and we want to

hear from you. Fr. George and I are doing our best to call, email and be in touch with you, but it would be wonderful if you were to reach out to us too. 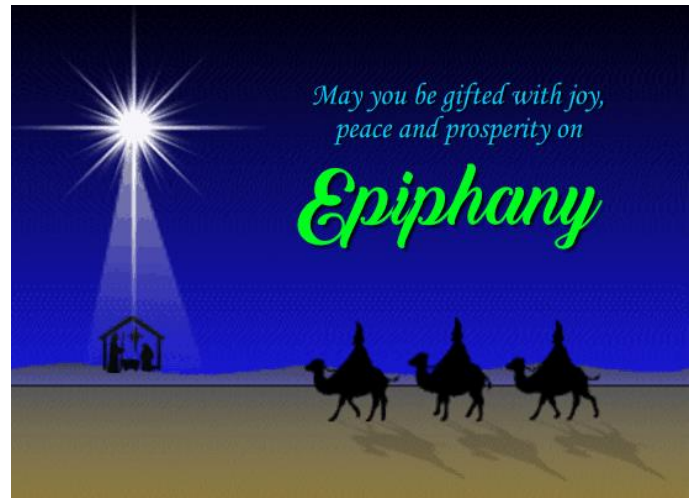
Silence of the Heart

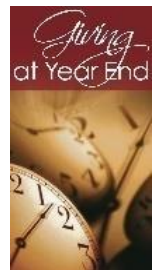
Thursday Morning Faith-Sharing

Dear friends,

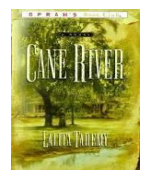
Happy New Year to all the parishioners of St. Agnes Catholic Church. My name is Manuel Chavira Jr, and I am one of the five Jesuits currently living at St. Agnes. Our pastor, Fr. Williams, asked me to briefly introduce myself and my ministry in this week's bulletin. I have been a Jesuit for a little over 6 years and am awaiting ordination to the priesthood. I am also preparing to become the Catholic chaplain at San Quentin State prison. As Fr. Williams mentioned a few bulletins ago, we are hoping that St. Agnes parishioners will participate in various forms of prison ministry that would include San Quentin. When and what this entails is still undetermined, but prison ministry is fundamental to our Catholic faith, the mission of the Society of Jesus and, from experience, I can say that it is life-giving to all involved.

In this Sunday's Gospel, we see the magi gazing upon a newborn baby who they know to be the King of the Jews. I wonder what the infant Christ saw in their gaze. Some knowledge theorists maintain that an infant's first sense of the self is their mother's gaze. What a mother sees in her child becomes, for the infant, the first sense of self. What love Jesus must have seen in Mary's eyes! Though there are many scholarly arguments regarding Jesus' knowledge, I feel Jesus' human knowledge of Himself began with Mary's gaze and perhaps, in some way, the Magi's gaze too. This, for me, is what prison ministry is. It is looking at the other with the love of Christ in one of the darkest places in our society. My hope for the New Year is that we all look at each other with the love of Christ. In our families, in our Church and in our ministries.
